A Year at a Glance

(April 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023)

- Welcomed three new Board Members at the 2022 AGM: Sarah Krahn,
 Linette Sandor and Teresa Norquay.
- Secured funding from the Provincial Perinatal Substance Use Program,
 Provincial Services Health Authority to continue year four of the Healthy
 Care Pregnancy Program Pilot Project and other deliverables related to
 perinatal substance use.
- Offered and completed the 2022-23 BCAPOP Nutrition Program, funded by the Quesnel Child Development Centre and in partnership with Vitamin Angels and Natural Factors.
- Planned the first in-person annual BCAPOP conference since 2019 and the pandemic.
- Planned, modified, and delivered continuing education opportunities including webinars, virtual member check-ins, Perinatal Substance Use 101 trainings, and a fall virtual conference.
- Created, approved, and implemented a budget for 2022-23 that was focused on the long-term financial sustainability of BCAPOP.
- Secured funding from the Province of BC to continue to implement The Pregnancy HUB (<u>www.pregnancyhub.org</u>), virtual prenatal education program free to all BC residents who are pregnant, postpartum and newly parenting.
- Diligently worked to attract new BCAPOP Program and Associate Members to diversify and strengthen BCAPOP, including student members.



2022-23 Treasurer's Report Lena Bullock, CPA CA

Here are our financial highlights from April 1, 2022 through March 31, 2023.

Our financial statements were compiled by PMT Chartered Professional Accountants.

On the Statement of Financial Position, we ended the year with a strong cash balance of just under \$800,000. Deferred income balances relate to funding received for PHSA and BC Gaming programming activities which will be completed in the 2024 fiscal year and membership fees for the 2024 fiscal year. Additional details are provided in Note 3.

The Statement of Changes in Net Assets shows a Net Asset balance of \$317,000.

On the Statement of Revenues and Expenses, BCAPOP had total revenues of just over \$1.2M. Revenue from the Vancouver Foundation was new this year. Total expenses were \$1.18M, very slightly higher than prior year. Training & events expenses were higher as events shifted back to in-person. This was offset by lower Project expenses. Overall, there was an excess of revenue over expenses of \$52,000.

In the accompanying notes, additional details of revenue recognized and deferred income are provided as well as the disclosure of remuneration as required by the Society Act of BC.

1. Basis of accounting

The basis of accounting applied in the preparation of the statement of financial position of B.C. Association of Pregnancy Outreach Programs as at March 31, 2023, and the statements of changes in net assets and revenues and expenditures for the year then ended is the historical cost basis and reflects cash transactions with the addition of:

- · Accounts receivable for unpaid invoices and GST rebate
- · Accounts payable and accrued liabilities
- deferral of restricted income to match when funds are spent
- deferral of membership fees to match period it is related to

2. Purpose of association

The B.C. Association of Pregnancy Outreach Programs (BCAPOP) was incorporated provincially under the Society Act of B.C. on March 12, 1996. On April 9, 2020 the association was granted charitable organization status with the Canada Revenue Agency. The association is exempt from the payment of income tax under Section 149(1) of the Income Tax Act.

The purpose of the BCAPOP is to improve the quality of maternal and infant health services by distributing prenatal vitamins, information on relevant research projects and by developing standards and guidelines for non-profit health organizations providing Pregnancy Outreach Programs to the public.
